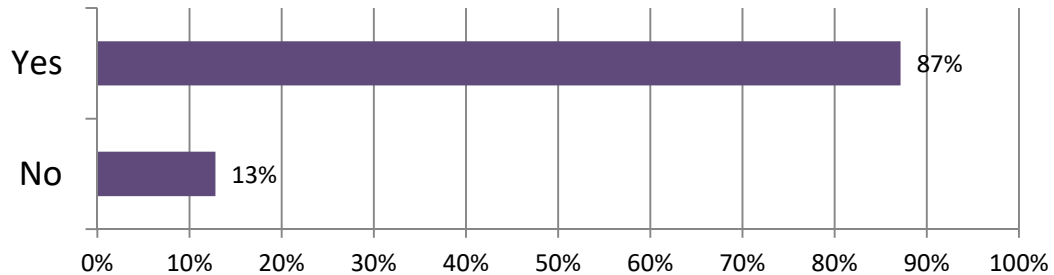


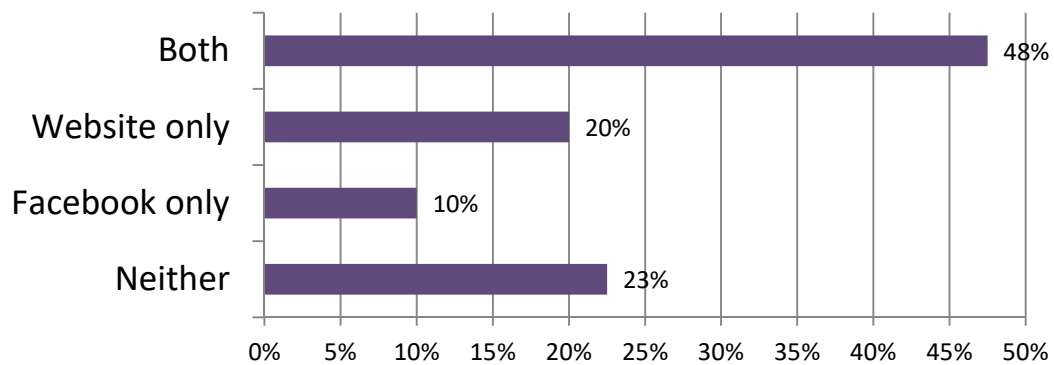

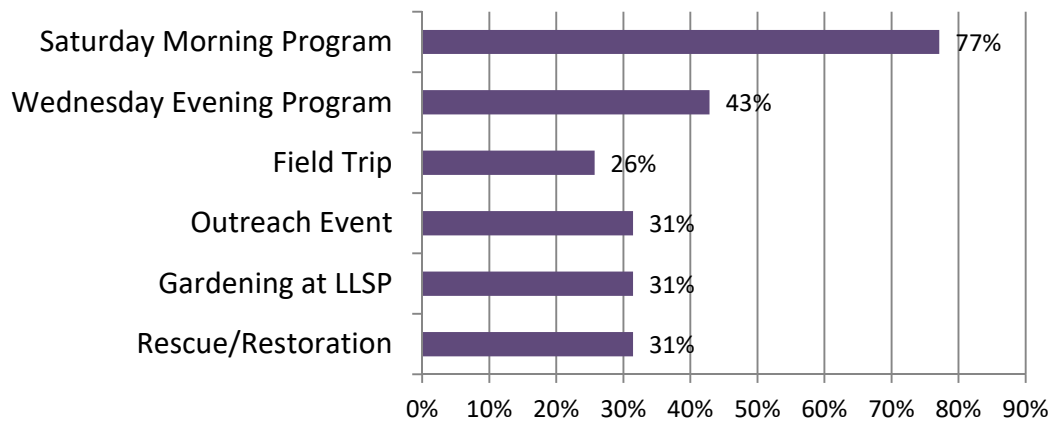
Q1. Are you an FNPS member?



Q2. Have you visited the Passionflower website and/or Facebook page?



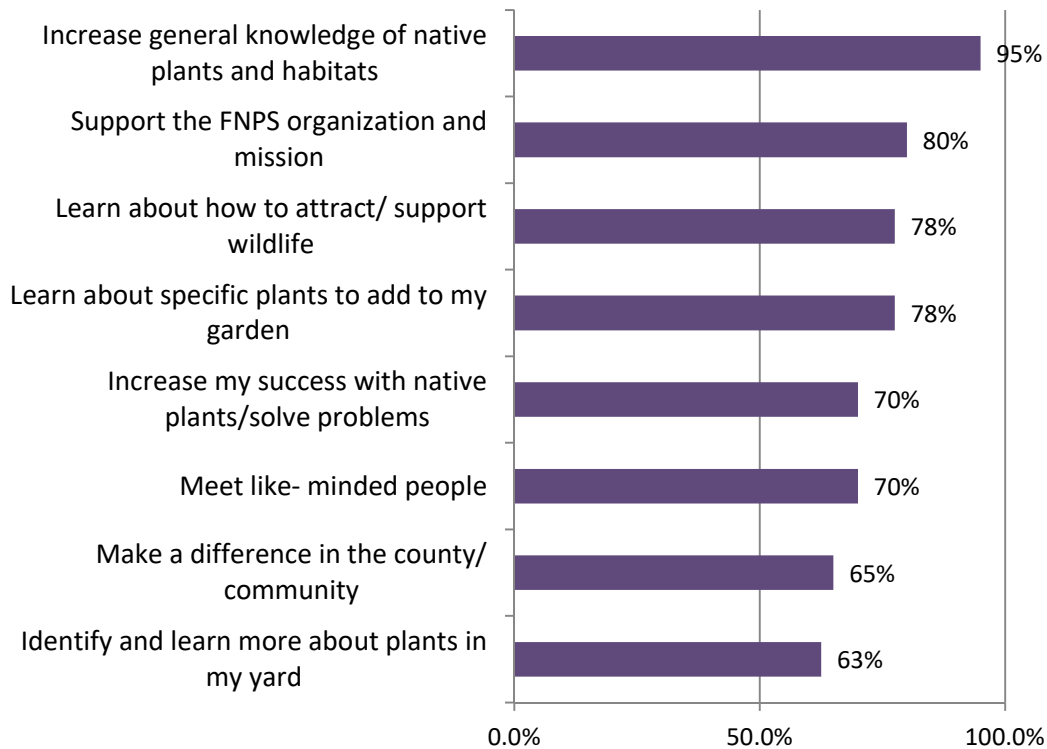
Q3. What Passionflower activities did you attend/participate in this year?



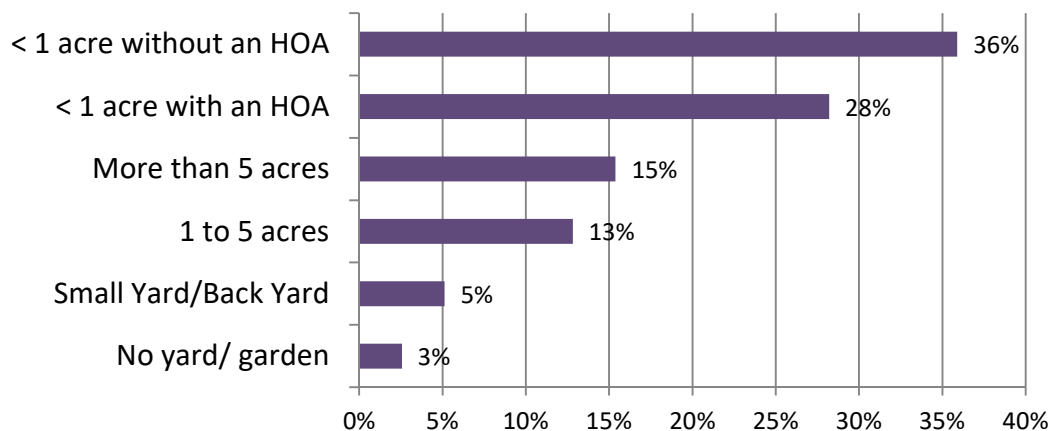
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Q4. What are your reasons for participating in Passionflower activities and/or belonging to FNPS?



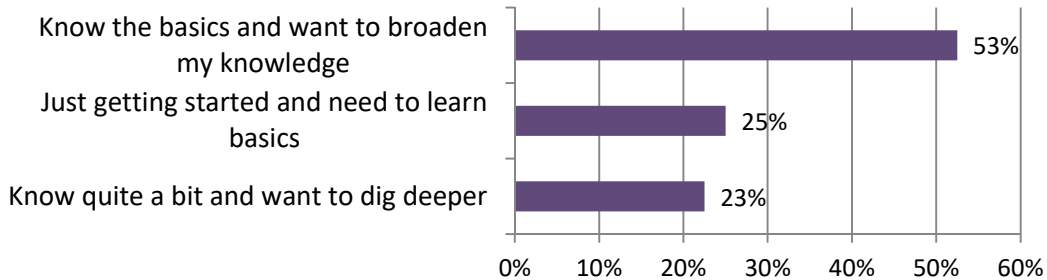
Q5. What type of landscape/property are you working on or seeking information for?



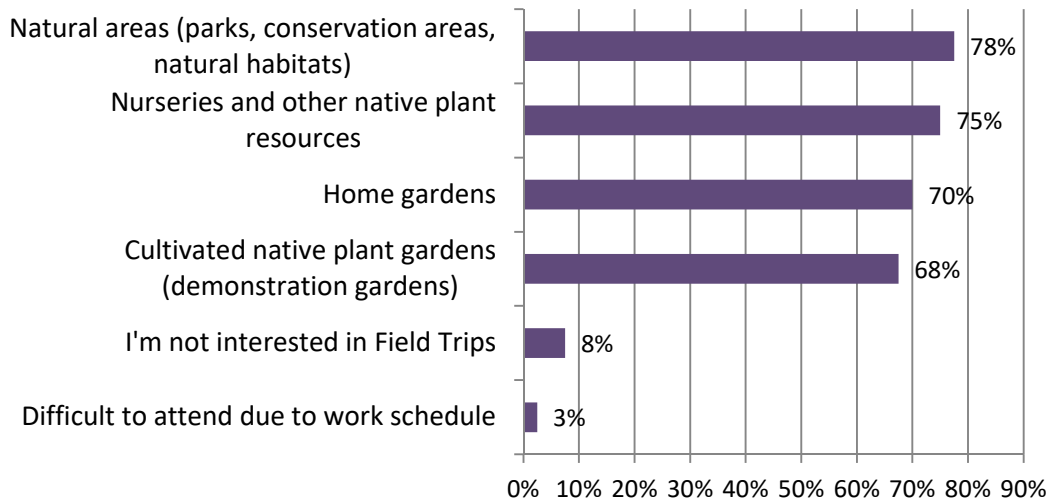

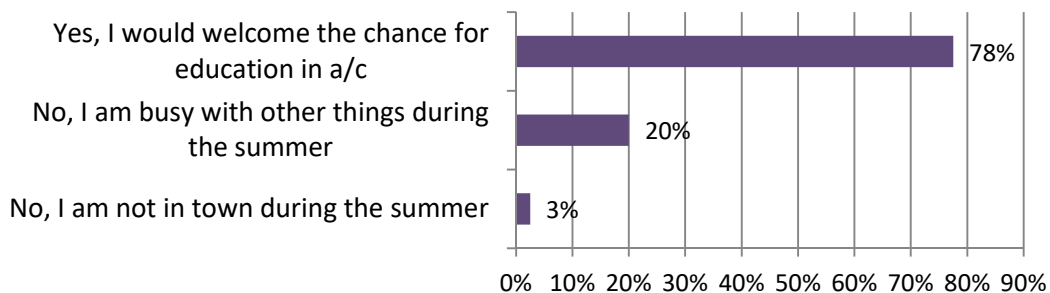
Q6. How would you describe your knowledge/experience with native plants?
