

FNPS Good Citizen Brochure Regional Submission Instructions

Please provide the following for your region:

1.
 - Choose a maximum of 7 native plant communities that are predominant or unique to your region
 - Provide a photo of each native plant community
2.
 - The name of the native plant community and a brief description of what is special/unique about it.
 - Word count should not exceed 40 words (excluding the name).
3.
 - Where to visit the native plant community IN YOUR REGION. Use the correct name of the natural area.
 - The county the natural area is located in.
4.
 - Come up with 3 different simple planting schemes people can try out at home. These should include easy-to-find and easy to grow plants that are appropriate to the region.
 - Provide 6 plant photos and plant names for each of the 3 schemes (a total of 18)
 - Alternate content: Use 2 planting schemes and 1 group of 6 invasive plants people should remove from their yards or avoid planting.

HOW TO SUBMIT INFORMATION:

A link will be sent to a Google Drive where each regional group can upload their information to a folder specific to them.

TEXT:

- Text should be sent as a WORD document.
- There is no need to format the text, but please proofread it before uploading

PHOTOS:

- Photos need to be high resolution (do not use photos taken from the internet).
- High resolution photos are 300 dpi at actual size. If shooting photos, use the highest resolution setting on your camera or phone.
- Include the name of the photographer and confirm in writing that FNPS has permission to use the photos in print (send a Word document along with the photos that contains this information)
- Re-name or otherwise key the photos so it is clear what they depict.

DEADLINE FOR MATERIALS:

We plan on sending the brochure and inserts to press in July. Based on the time needed to process the information, all materials need to be submitted no later than May 1, 2021
